Upcoming changes in TCSI

Pacific Engagement Visa

- There is currently a bill before parliament that will amend HESA to give holders of the Pacific Engagement Visa (PEV) the same access to CSPs and HELP as Australian citizens, while they are in Australia.
- The PEV is a permanent resident visa, and generally permanent resident visa holders are not eligible for HELP.
- PEV students will be treated similar to permanent humanitarian and New Zealand
 Special Category visa holders.
- Commencement is from 1 February 2024, or from when the Bills pass, whichever is later.
- To support the introduction of PEV a new E358 Citizen resident code 'P' will be added.

CHESSN Management

- TCSI allocates and manages CHESSNs based on personal information reported on the Student packet
- Reporting of CHESSNs is not required
- CHESSNs may no longer need to be maintained in your Student Management System

Warning about late reporting

Four new RTV warnings


Designed to detect new loans reported just before or after student loan indexation at the ATO for:

 FEE-HELP, HECS-HELP, OS-HELP, SA-HELP, STARTUP-HELP

(i.e. 20 April 2024 for the financial year 2022-23)

Warnings will also detect changes to unit enrolment packets that result in a loan being created

(e.g. changing the HELP Loan Amount so it is greater than \$0 or removing a remission reason code.)



Startup Year

The Australian Government has established Startup Year to support students' participation in startup courses at Australian higher education providers.

- New Course of Study Type (E310) '51' 'STARTUP-HELP Loan Course'
- EFTSL limits between 0.5 and 1.0
- New Student Status Code (E490) '290' 'STARTUP-HELP Loan'
- Student entitlements will be visible via:
 - the HELP balances API
 - TCSI Data Entry portal.

Microcredentials Pilot

Reporting in TCSI:

- New Course of Study Type (E310) '52' 'Microcredentials'
- Student Status Code (E490) aligns with other FEE-HELP approved courses i.e. '302' or '230'
- New validations will restrict:
 - Course EFTSL
 - the number of student places at the provider
 - Specific fields of education
- The Policy team will work with Pilot participants to gather further information outside of the TCSI solution.



TCSI Loan Monitoring: E392 – Maximum Student Contribution code missing Live Data Report	This report identifies students and associated course and unit enrolment records where the Maximum Student Contribute code has not been recorded.

Higher Education and PIR Data Verification

Verification is part of the reporting requirements and is a declaration that the data reported is complete, accurate and finalised. The department uses the verified data to publish information on each organisation and may affect provider financials. The verification process gives providers a final opportunity to check data carefully, as changes cannot be made to datasets after verification.

Upcoming changes to E392 Maximum Student Contribution Code

Background

- Changes were made to Student Contribution and Commonwealth Contribution rates by the previous Government's Job-Ready Graduates package.
- Where an existing student would be made worse off by the changes, they were 'Grandfathered' so they could remain on the old rates. Existing students that would be better off or new students are 'non-grandfathered' and are subject to new rates.
- The Commonwealth Contribution, depends on the Grandfathering status of the student, including where a student doesn't have to pay a Student Contribution (e.g. exemption scholarships). Currently E392 can be reported without a code that indicates the correct Commonwealth Contribution.
- Changes are being made to E392 Maximum Student Contribution amount and RTVs to ensure that there is sufficient information for the Department to better identify the appropriate Commonwealth Contribution amount.

Impacts

- Changes outlined in the presentation are planned to go into production from late October 2023, they will only apply to units with a census date of 1 January 2024 onwards.
- This will support clearer identification of CGS Contribution amounts for 2024 and 2025 CGS funding, under the Interim Funding Arrangements
- The change concerns CSP units. These are units with E490 codes of 201, 204, 260, 261, 262 and 263.
- There is limited impact on non-CSP units.

Old v New E392 options – Contribution Exempt Units

Old v New E392 options – Contribution Liable Units

E490 Code			New E392 options
201	Deferred all or part of the student contribution through HECS-HELP	Null/blank and 2 – 9	7, 8, 9
204	Paid full student contribution up-front	Null/blank and 2 – 9	7, 8, 9

Note: new E392 options are for units with a census date of 1 January 2024 onwards

Non-CSP units

- Non-CSP units were blocked by the RTV10453, when trying to report an E392 code.
- This forced units with E490 codes of '230', '231', '232', '233', '270', '271', '290', '301', '302', '303', '304', '305', '310', '311' or '331' to be reported as blank/null.
- The new RTV10901, covered in this presentation will block the unit enrolment unless the E392 is blank/null, for:
 - Those formerly covered by RTV10453
 - Any other non-CSP coded E490 units.

Ceasing the use of '0' from 1 January 2024

 Reporting a '0' for E392 will be end dated. Where a unit with a census date on or after 1 January 2024 is reported with a '0' it will result in the following fatal validation message being displayed:



Error

10902ENRLOG: Maximum Student Contribution Code (E392) is required for Commonwealth supported students.

Change to RTV10451

• As the required E392 reporting can be managed by the new RTV10902 – the former RTV that enforced reporting of '0' for E392, where no student contribution applied (E490: 260, 261, 262 and 263) will only apply to units with census dates before 1 January 2024.

 As the required E392 reporting can be managed by the new RTV10902 – the former RTV that enforced reporting of '2 to 9' for E392 where students are in a CSP and have a Student Contribution amount will only apply to units with census dates before 1 January 2024.

• As the required E392 reporting can be managed by the new RTV10901 – the former RTV that enforced reporting of 'blank' for E392 where students are in a non- CSP unit will only apply to units with census dates before 1 January 2024.

Change to SV00005

- The scheduled validation to ensure E392 is reported for Commonwealth Supported Place units by the census date is being replaced by the new up-front RTVs for Census dates from 1 January 2024 inclusive.
- It will only apply to units with census dates before 1 January 2024, in maintenance of existing arrangement for previous years.

Updates to SLEMS (Student Learning Entitlement Management System) – TCSI Analytics

- The Department is working on additions to TCSI Analytics to add reports to help providers manage the Student Learning Entitlement policy.
- Further RTVs to notify providers of student SLE amounts are being considered and developed.
